There is a rich diversity of ways of knowing, which relies on a broad and open-process.

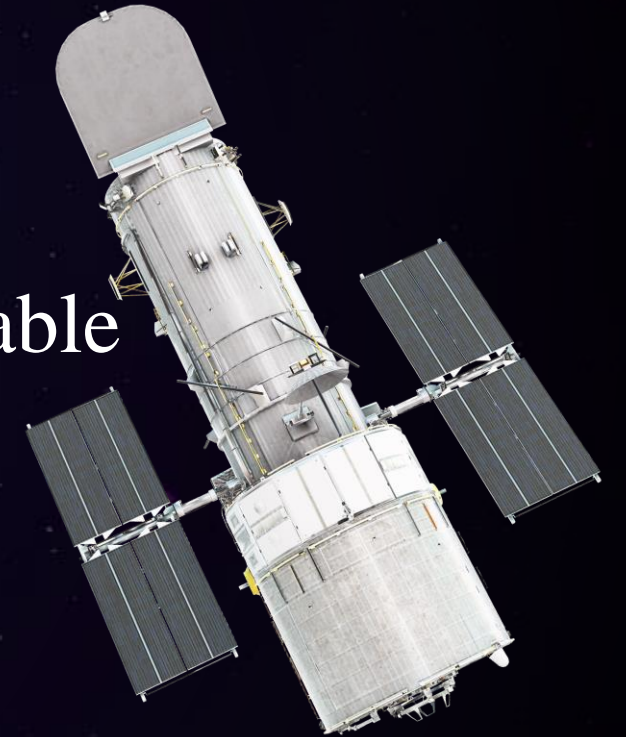

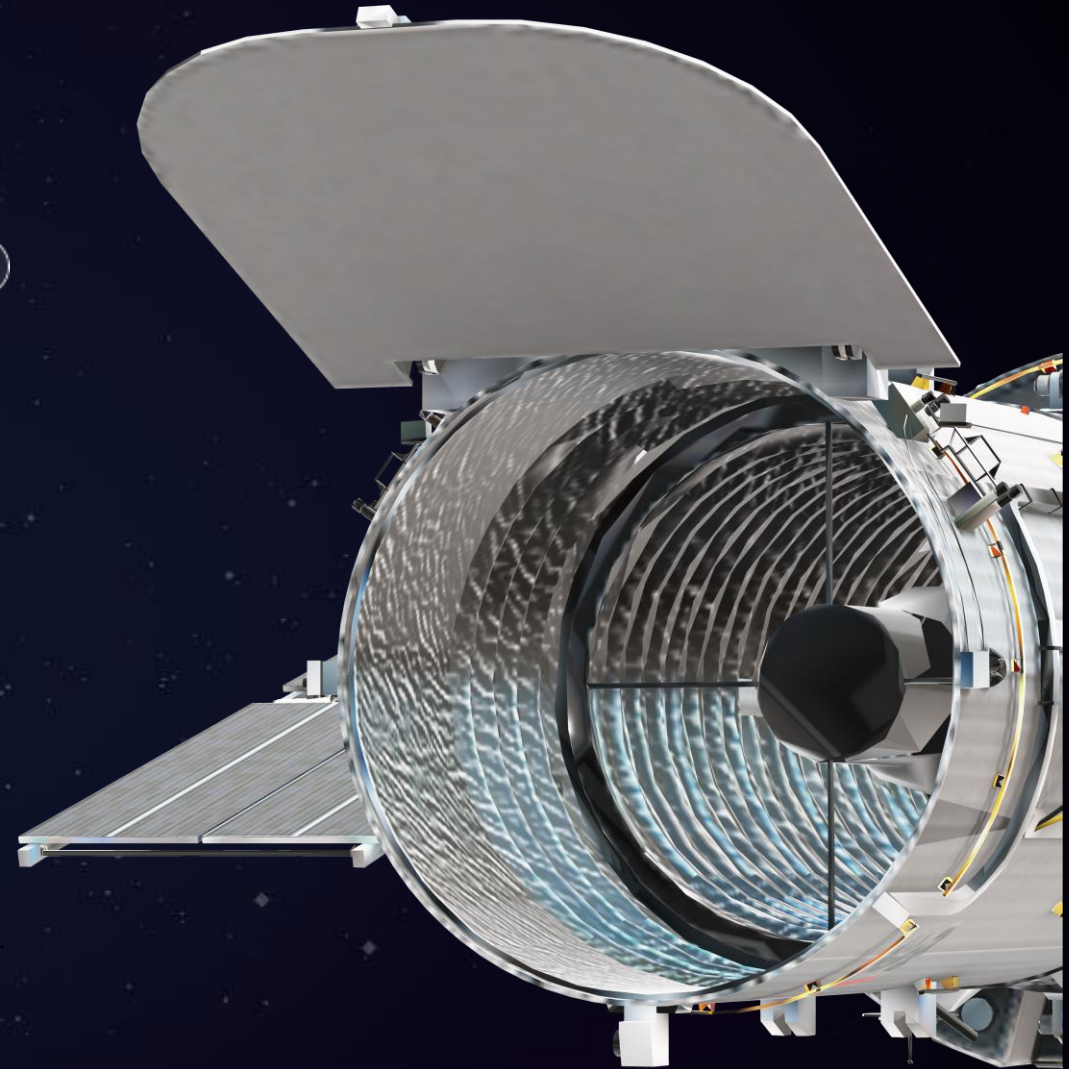

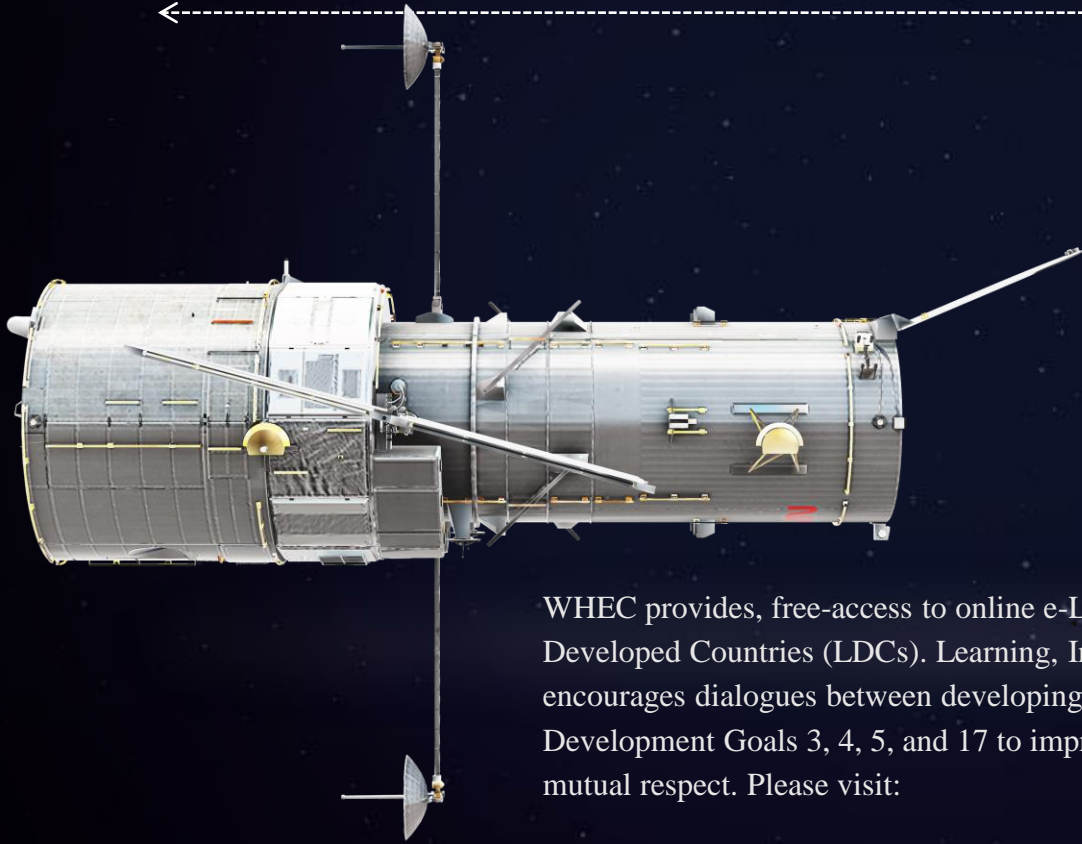
