Key recommendations for action

The global movement towards education- and health-for-all, will directly facilitate achieving all Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Education and health can become the driving force behind poverty reduction strategies, in the service of humanity, democratization of the resources and an inputs for regional development in social and economic development – especially relevant for universal health coverage and access. Our recommendations for action are:

- 1. Health and educational services should be free or low-cost and provided by educators and healthcare providers, who are non-judgmental.
- 2. Promote education, training and professional development for women of all ages.
- 3. Measure and publicly report on progress to achieve gender equality at regional, national and international levels.
- 4. Building the evidence-based, mainly community-based research that is affordable and has immediate implications for programs and local partners.
- 5. Provide strong and coherent leadership in support of Member States' priorities and efforts, building effective partnership and civil society, to accelerate SDGs.
