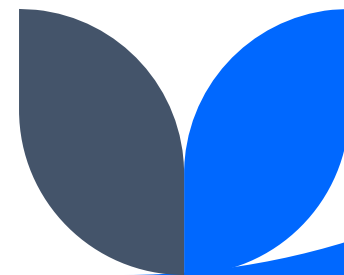

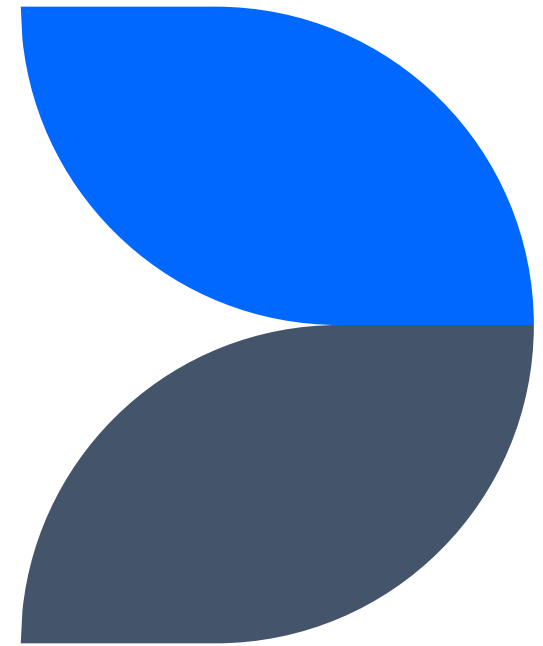
The Power of Partnership
