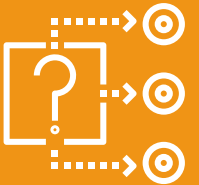

To discuss sound policies and planning as well as efficient implementation arrangements, to achieve our common agenda.

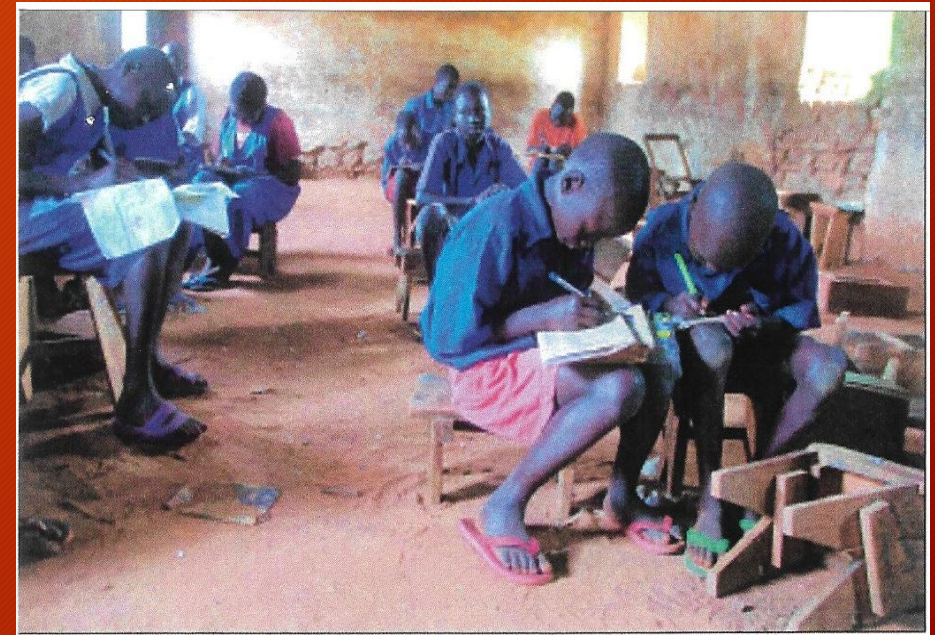
To generate discussion and action on the role of education, knowledge and learning in view of the predicted, possible and preferred futures of humanity and the planet.
