This knowledge that touches patients, all over the world, is the contribution of many groups, universities, and individuals, who participate in the peer-review process.

As the practice of medicine evolves, so too, do WHEC Practice Bulletins.

Our faculty is from the finest Universities and Teaching Hospitals from USA and many other countries, who have donated their time and talent to plan and develop this initiative with the WHEC. I am grateful to the Physician's Board for their contributions.

WHEC's Global Health Line is technically an Internet-application of WHEC in United States of America (USA), an Internet-facing collaboration platform, based on mutual benefit and mutual respect, approved and hosted by WHEC in USA. It

welcomes International Organizations (IGOs), NGOs affiliated with Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations, and the Academic Institutions.

Big Question – Where do we go from here?

WHEC's collaboration with WHO Academy and UNESCO will bring together adult learning, behavioral science, programs for youth-development, and cutting-edge learning technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI) and virtual reality.
