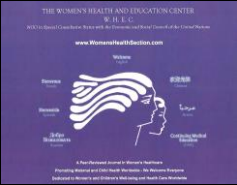

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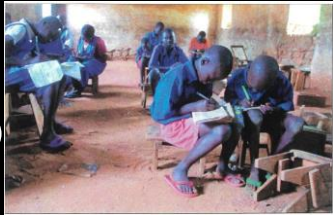
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Women's Health and Education Center (WHEC) established on 12 April 2001 to undertake initiatives with UN, WHO and UNESCO

LESSONS LEARNED & AREAS OF FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

- **WHEC Global Health Line** - launched on 4 July 2013, which is serving, in 227 countries and territories, about 14 to 15 million subscribers every year, can help the SDGs and 2030 UN Agenda
- **Implementation** - we must implement comprehensive and inclusive policies, change our way of thinking, and prioritize efforts to eliminate poverty and bridge the digital divide. It is crucial for governments to integrate social, economic, and environmental policies to promote social justice,
- **Openness in science** is essential aspect of scientific process. When open AI and big data meet the social reality of human cooperation and governance, it becomes more sustainable and help to close digital divide.
- **Today's global Challenges** - in view of the scale of today's global challenges and the great potential of science, technology and innovation to deliver responses, it is necessary to mobilize financial and knowledge resources from government, businesses, academia and civil societies. Both public and private sectors play important roles in financing, research, and development.
