Summary of the Side Event

Our special focus is on SDGs # 3, 4, 5, 10, 16 and 17.

To catalyze collaborative networks – cutting across disciplines, sectors and borders.

Concept Note

<u>Dr. Rita Luthra:</u> President, Women's Health and Education Center (WHEC) opened the session with introduction of various initiatives of WHEC, and Recommendations for Areas Future Development: <u>WHEC Statement</u>

- 1. Health Promoting Schools both physical and mental health;
- 2. A long-term plan that is binding on all parties at all times;
- 3. Sustainable finance;
- 4. Support for pilot projects/programs and their conversion to regular programs as soon as they prove successful;
- 5. Involvement of health authorities at national, state and district levels;
- 6. Government-commitment is necessary;
- 7. A Global Fund for Continuing Medical Education (CME);

8. Improving the accessibility for girls, women and minorities to STEMM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medical) Programs.

<u>Distinguished Speaker & Lecture by Dr. Roger P. Worthington</u> (London, U.K.): Fellow, UN SDG Publishers Compact; focused on *Educating to address healthcare needs for refugees and displaced persons*. It generated lots of interest and questions from the audience.

<u>Dr. Debra Rowe:</u> President of U.S. Partnership for Education for SDGs, focal point of her presentation was on climate change. "What it means to be a climate refugee."

Ms. Dana Compton: Managing Director and Publisher, American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE); (USA); discussed - making STEMM programs accessible for girls, women and minorities.

Ms. Upasana Chauhan, Main NGO Representative at the UN, New York; International Advisor & Activist; Women's Health and Education Center (WHEC), New York, NY; (USA) highlighted - Contribution of Sexual-Minorities (LGBTQ+) to the Science, Technology & Innovation. Women's Health and Education Center (WHEC) promotes, optimal health and wellbeing of all children and all adults. A core mission of WHEC is to support the best interests of all children and all adults, regardless of their home or family structure of the common principles of justice. Our messages were: Understand and promote understanding; Create an inclusive environment; Plan for continuity of care; Provide trauma-informed care – understand the impact of identity-based trauma on cognition, emotion, behavior, and perception; and Educate the public and healthcare professionals to reduce the sigma and harassment and violence in lives of LGBTQ+ people.

<u>Dr. Dawna K. Jenne:</u> Additional NGO Representative of WHEC to UN, presented the STEMM success stories.
