Module 2 – Internet Searching and Website Evaluation

Assessing Impact Factor

- Impact Factor – calculated daily, monthly and yearly for user data, experience and frequently accessed reviews, practice bulletins and articles.
- Used as a measure for the relative importance of the journals within its field; journals with higher impacts factors are deemed to be more important than those lower ones.
- As an author/writer/editor of <http://www.WomensHealthSection.com> you can adopt editorial policies that increases impact factor, e.g. editorials (not citable) vs. short original articles (citable); plus review articles cited more often.
- Impact Factor scores can ‘influence’ promotion and tenure at universities throughout the world.
- Longer term monitoring of the health of populations is sometimes a component of larger proposals. We have various forms of collaboration with WHEC for you to explore, and we welcome your thoughts and suggestions.
- Many different toolkits are available, as are basic guides, to you to carry out our joint missions and projects.

Why Internet-Search-Strategy is Important?

The Need / Areas for Future Development

- Good health and good health care includes the provision of information to consumers or professionals, policy-makers (reliable, accurate, up-to-date information); easily accessible and affordable;
- Currently there is information explosion – billions and billions of documents in the www; hard to find the ‘needle in the hay stack’ and to know which source is best for a specific situation in clinical practice, patient-care and best-practices applications;
- Limited availability of evidence-based medicine in developing and Least Developed Countries (LCDs) – clinicians are not using enough evidence in clinical practice in many regions of the world.
- Systemic search strategy should be adopted when dealing with clinical questions to avoid ‘information malpractice.’
- To promote quality care and best-practices worldwide.
- To promote net-neutrality and affordable-access-to-Internet.
- Establishing a global-fund for continuing medical education.

Developing A Search Strategy

Process overview – Join the efforts

1. Ask: State your topic as a question to focus your research.
2. Define need: Define your information need.
3. Identify concepts: Identify main concepts from your questions.
4. Select terms: Select unique words, synonyms, spellings, plurals, broader topic.
5. Select sources: Select appropriate professional sources;
6. Search: Construct a search with appropriate commands for the system selected.
7. Revise: Be prepared to revise the refine your search.
8. Manage Results: Retrieve records, full text, save, print, cite, e-mail.
9. Evaluate: Find out how good the information is.
10. Apply: Answer your question.

Module 5

This module helps mastering the skills necessary to utilize the WHEC database. This will help you to build on searching skills the visitor has learned.

While working with Filters, you probably noticed the line that text availability filter that has the abstract, free full text, full text available options. By clicking on these options, you would filter your search to include all articles with abstracts or full text articles or those articles that are available as free full text by various portals and links or those citations that have abstracts.

Publication date, language, age, type of article, field tag filters & more.
