Concept Note

The global movement towards education and health for all will directly facilitate the United Nations (UN) 2030 Agenda. These socialled **Life Lessons**, are very popular, These programs are helping schools, universities, teachers, students, and administrators to plan and develop *Health Promoting Schools*. We encourage institutions to use this as a resource to increase engagement, learning and good mental health.
- Life-long Learning Opportunities: We commit to promoting quality life-long learning opportunities for all, in all settings and at all levels of education.
